

Activity 3.2.2 Fluid Power Practice Problems

Answer the following questions. Sketch each, then label all known values. Be sure to include all steps and units throughout each solution.

All problems assume that conditions are ideal. Forces such as friction are not considered.

Problems

A pneumatic system is producing 100 lb/in.^2 of gauge pressure. A cylinder is needed to press an adhesive label onto a product. It has been determined that 5 lb of force is optimal to complete this task.
